UCLA Law's Center on Reproductive Health, Law, and Policy (CRHLP) welcomes applications for spring externs to support our interdisciplinary work.

About CRHLP: The UCLA Law Center on Reproductive Health, Law, and Policy is a think tank and research center developing long-term, lasting solutions that advance all aspects of reproductive justice and address the current national crisis of abortion access. We are lawyers, policy experts, scholars, and researchers who are working to increase access to abortion and contraception, end racial and economic disparities in maternal health outcomes, support people who decide to build families, and dismantle the gender bias that limits reproductive justice. We do this by creating innovative legal strategies, policy solutions, and opportunities to convene around some of the most complex issues facing women, pregnant people, and families today. Founded in 2022, we are independently funded and rely upon grants from state funds, foundations, and private donors to accomplish our many programs and objectives.

About the Position: Part-time student externs will have the opportunity to contribute to our legal and interdisciplinary work, which includes policy and legal research and analysis and contributing to empirical research. This Spring, projects may include topics such as the reproductive rights of minors, constitutional protections for maternal health, protecting access to mifepristone, and more. As available, externs will also have the opportunity to participate in convenings and meetings with advocates, scholars, health care providers, and community members on an array of reproductive health and justice topics.
