Limited Access Policy

I. INTRODUCTION & PURPOSE

The primary responsibility of the Law Library is to support the teaching and research functions of the UCLA School of Law and other University of California (UC) researchers who need to use legal materials; therefore, access to the UCLA Law Library is restricted to Authorized Users. All users must present official photo identification to verify their user status. Upon entering the Library, all Limited Access Users must receive a Daily Access Ticket. These Daily Access Tickets are limited in number and will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis.

Note to UCLA faculty teaching or supervising UCLA students who need on-going access to the Law Library's materials for research or assignments: read our "Exemption Handout" for information about obtaining a temporary exemption to this policy for these students.

II. DEFINITIONS OF AUTHORIZED USERS

Regular Access User: UCLA law students; other UC law school students; current UC faculty and staff; UC law school alumni; members in good standing of a state bar association; members of the judiciary and their staff; current faculty of other degree-conferring institutions of higher education in California (excluding online schools); current U.S. law school faculty; current students from law schools located outside of Los Angeles County (excluding online schools).

Limited Access User: UCLA non-law students; non-law students from other UC campuses; depository users.

III. STATEMENT

- 1. Only Authorized Users shall have access to the UCLA Law Library.
- 2. Access to the UCLA Law Library for Limited Access Users is limited to a small number of users per day. Access to the Library does not include access to areas designated for the exclusive use of UCLA Law students, faculty, and staff, such as Law Library conference rooms, the Tower Reading Room, and the After Hours Reading Room.
- To access the Law Library during Law School final exam periods, all Limited Access Users must demonstrate to the <u>Circulation Desk staff member on duty an immediate need to use Law Library print materials that are not available in</u> <u>other UCLA libraries</u>. Upon demonstration of such immediate need, a special access pass may be issued at the <u>discretion of the Circulation Desk staff member on duty</u>. (Users should ask at the Circulation Desk about specific dates <u>and requirements for access</u>.)
- 4. All users must present photo identification each time they enter the Library and non-UCLA law users will be required to sign in and identify their institutional affiliation. Limited Access Users will be issued Daily Access Tickets that must be kept visible at all times. Ticket holders must abide by all Library policies. Any ticket holder who is found in an area reserved for UCLA Law students, faculty, or staff, who is found violating any other Library policy, or who is disruptive in any way, will have his/her ticket revoked and must leave the Library immediately.
- 5. Tickets are issued on a daily basis to an individual and are not transferrable. Individual tickets may be cancelled by a Law Library Supervisor whenever necessary to ensure useful access to the facility for Regular Access Users. Ticket holders exiting the Library must present the Daily Access Ticket upon re-entering the Library. When leaving for the day, please return all Daily Access Tickets to the checkpoint so that they may be reissued.
- 6. The Library is not open to the general public except that members of the general public may have access to United States government documents acquired by the Law Library through its membership in the Federal Depository Library

Program. Please note that the Law Library receives only a very small portion of depository materials. Access to depository documents is available to the public; however, because of our limited selection of depository materials and/or staffing availability, we cannot guarantee access to the needed materials unless prior arrangements have been made. Please review our "Access to Government Documents" handout for more information about our policy and instructions for making prior arrangements for access to our federal depository materials.

7. Student from non-U.S. law schools (not online schools) are permitted to access the Law Library only 20 days per year. Those seeking access for longer periods or seeking a letter of invitation must apply to the Visiting Researchers Program.

IV. IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

A. Regular Access Users

Regular Access Users shall have access to the Law Library upon presentation of the required identification:

B. Limited Access Users

Limited Access Users must have a Daily Access Ticket to enter the Library. If all tickets have been distributed, users may request a special access pass to be issued by a Circulation Desk staff member based on a demonstrated, immediate need to use Law Library print materials that are not available in other UCLA libraries. Limited Access Users must present the following required identification:
