

J. Michael Luttig served on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit for 15 years, from 1991 to 2006. Following his service on the U.S. Court of Appeals, Judge Luttig was executive vice president and general counsel of The Boeing Company and counselor and senior advisor to the Boeing CEO and board of directors from 2006 to 2020. Before he was appointed to the federal bench by President George H.W. Bush, Judge Luttig served as assistant attorney general at the U.S. Department of Justice and counselor to the attorney general of the United States from 1989-1991. He was assistant counsel to the president at the White House from 1981 to 1982 under President Ronald Reagan. From 1982 to 1983, he was a law clerk to then-Judge Antonin Scalia of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. From 1983 to 1985, he served as a law clerk and then special assistant to chief justice of the United States Warren E. Burger. Judge Luttig earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from Washington and Lee University and his law degree from the University of Virginia.
